OUR PHILOSOPHY

The Serendipity Pre-Kindergarten program is based on 'learning through play' concept. For the child, play is their way of coping with life and learning fundamentals of living in a very complex, fast-moving world. We try to provide an atmosphere where the child can move, at their own pace, and learn when they are ready to learn.

Serendipity believes in equal opportunity and participates with early intervention agencies and special needs children. All special needs children are fully integrated into our program with the assistance of an aide.

Children learn through a process of sensory information. They hear, feel, see, smell and taste. Therefore, in a creative play program, we emphasize activities that involve the senses as well as lots of movement. Play in a natural function and the learning it leads to is achieved by the well-accepted process of "doing" by a sequence of exploration, testing and reception.

The Pre-Kindergarten is a place for learning. We want to provide appropriate play experiences, which contribute to the overall growth and development of the child. Our creative play philosophy is based on the premise that the more our emotions are involved, the more sensory information we receive, the more easily learning takes place. That is why play is important and why we want to promote the principle of learning by doing, learning through play, and the right of a child to enjoy childhood.

OUR HISTORY

Serendipity Pre-Kindergarten has been serving the families of Okotoks since 1971. Our school was established by a group of parents that identified a need for a quality preschool choice in our community. Our not-for-profit Association continues in that spirit, operating through a volunteer Board of Directors filled from our parent membership.

OUR PROGRAM

Please Note: This is a general outline of a day and can vary based on teacher, theme and other wonderful experiences. ** Some of the program will be utilized in our outdoor yard. Please make sure children come dressed appropriately for the weather each day.

ARRIVAL AND WELCOME

The teachers and other classmates greet the children as they arrive and enjoy some outdoor time. A time for socialization and exploration.

NAME/LETTER RECOGNITION AND PRACTICE

A variety of manipulative (table top), puzzles and age-appropriate activities.

CIRCLE TIME

A time to come together for sharing, discussion, songs, weather, calendar, finger plays and creative movement.

CENTER TIME- Teacher and student led activities.

Children may choose from a variety of centers: sand and water, paint easel, art activities, home center, blocks, listening, reading, gross motor center (e.g. climber, balance beam).

SNACK TIME

Children will bring a nutritious snack from home in easy to open containers and a water bottle. Please mark all containers. Serendipity is a **NUT FREE** Zone. Birthdays are a celebration at Serendipity and the Birthday child can bring, cookies, cupcakes, rice Krispie squares for the class to enjoy. ** All items must come sealed in their original packaging.

CIRCLE TIME/STORY TIME/SHOW & TELL

A time to encourage a love for books and reading, along with an enrichment of vocabulary and an exposure to a variety of language.

DEPARTURE/HOME TIME

SERENDIPITY DISCIPLINE POLICY

1. Each child will be respected as an individual. Each incident will be treated as an individual situation.
2. Consideration for the temperament and uniqueness of the child will determine the type of intervention.
3. Limits will be stated kindly but firmly.
4. The problem will be identified with the child and then choices will be used to help redirect the behavior to a more positive activity or action.
5. Positive reinforcement of an appropriate behavior is the main focus of our discipline policy.

As a license holder, Serendipity Pre-Kindergarten will not, with respect to a child in the program, inflict or cause to be inflicted any form of physical punishment, verbal or physical degradation or emotional deprivation; deny or threaten to deny any basic necessity or use or permit the use of any form or physical restraint, confinement or isolation.

PRE-KINDERGARTEN CLASS TIMES & FEES

THREE-Year-Old Program (must be 3 years of age to start in the program)

All children entering the program must be toilet trained. Classes start promptly and the doors will be open at that time for greeting of the children by the teacher. Please be on time!

**** \$100.00 NON-REFUNDABLE REGISTRATION FEE IS REQUIRED**

**** \$10 School Supply is also collected at time of Registration**

1. Registration and school supply fees are due upon registration. **First and last month's fees will be due September 1, 24.** Class Fees may be made via e-transfer to serendipityokotoks@gmail.com, or in the form of postdated cheques, September through May on the 1st of each month, or a yearly lump sum payment in the form of one cheque. Please make a separate cheque for the registration & supply fee.
2. Cheques are made payable to: SERENDIPITY PRE-KINDERGARTEN
3. NSF cheques will be charged a fee of \$20.00
4. If a family is choosing to pay via e-transfer, please note first and last month class fees are due on or before September 1 (before the school year starts).
5. If any family is in arrears more than 15 days, membership privileges will be suspended until fees are paid and the child is reinstated.
6. We require **one calendar month's written notice**, if you will be withdrawing your child from the program. Please give the notice to your teacher and email serendipityokotoks@gmail.com.
7. When a family registers two (2) or more children for the same school year only, a single registration fee will be charged.

8. There is no reduction in fees for holidays, sickness, or any other absences including school closures for emergencies at the discretion of the Board of Directors.
9. Should a child be temporarily withdrawn from the program through a teacher's or other recommendation, parent membership continues until the child is permanently withdrawn. There will be no refunds of fees for withdrawal of a child for periods of less than 4 weeks.

REPORT FOR DOCTORS OR OTHER ORGANIZATIONS

Every so often, parents are requested by their physician or outside agency to have our teachers complete an evaluation form or assessment of their child. Should a family need/require a form, letter or report filled in for an outside agency, organization or doctor there is a \$30 fee for this service to cover our teachers time to fill this in for your family. We require 72 hours to complete any requests.

CLASS SIZE

We also encourage our parents to participate, which improves our ratio. One of our objectives at Serendipity is to keep our adult to child ratio low enough to allow the teachers to meet the individual needs of each child. Ratio is 1:9 or better.

OTHER INFORMATION

VOLUNTEERS

From the Board of Directors to helping out as a guest speaker, it all makes our school a special place for our children to be. It gives them the true sense of community in a smaller atmosphere. As a parent run preschool, it is important to have volunteers to help us with daily activities. Our most important commitments will be the casino which is held every 3 years and members of the Board. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

We are a nonprofit society managed completely by a volunteer Board of Directors. This board is elected each year at registration. Being a board member is a one-year commitment. It entails a meeting once a month and occasionally involves subcommittees. All board members are involved in the following:

- Personnel decisions, including contracts and salaries
- Deciding which programs our children will participate in
- Fundraising
- Community involvement
- Budgeting and money management
- Future planning for the school

WHAT IS THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING?

Each year in October, we have an Annual General Meeting for all of the members of the organization. At this meeting, we get input from parents about what they would like to see in our programs and in our school. We review financial information and there is an opportunity for any questions you may have to be answered. We encourage everyone to attend.

FUNDRAISING

In order to keep our tuition down, and provide the programs that make our school so unique, we fundraise. Our main fundraiser is the casino operated at Century Casino in Calgary. We usually do this once every three years and it requires 40 volunteers to which we must get through our membership. We also do 2-3 smaller fundraisers like Coco Brooks Pizza, Cookies and Cheesecakes, Christmas campaign or others of interest. We choose the smaller fundraisers through the Board and provide them to our parents as an opportunity to shop at home while benefiting our school. We do not ask that parents or children go door to door or purchase items if they do not require them. If you have any ideas or questions about fundraising, please direct them to the school's fundraising coordinator.

Things bought through fundraising in 2021-2022: New laptop for administrative work, fridge, toys, craft supplies for the classroom and outside areas.

CRIMINAL RECORD CHECK

At Serendipity, the safety of your child is of the utmost important to us. All volunteers need to get a criminal record check with vulnerability search done before being able to volunteer in the classroom. We provide you with a letter to provide the RCMP at a reduced cost. To request additional letters please contact the administrative director at serendipityokotoks@gmail.com.

All of our staff, child's aide workers and volunteers must have the criminal record checks done and submitted prior to being in the classroom.

SCHOOL HOLIDAYS AND CLOSURES

Serendipity observes all statutory holidays and oversees most of the same school holidays as the Foothills School Division. Parents will be notified through our newsletters and Dojo of days off and on the website.

Holidays include: Labor Day (September), Thanksgiving (October), Remembrance Day (November), Winter Holiday Break (December into January), New Years (January), Family Day Week (February), Easter (March or April), Good Friday, (March or April) & Memorial Day (May).

In the event of a closure, the voice message at the school will reflect this (403-852-0788). Otherwise, please use your own discretion.

COMMUNICATION

Our teachers are available to discuss your questions and concerns with you at your request. If you would like to discuss anything with the teaching staff, make arrangements with them before or after class and they will either discuss it at that time, or make arrangements for a more convenient time when there are fewer interruptions for both parties. At present, we don't have any formal parent teacher interviews but they can be arranged on an individual basis should they be requested.

EXTRACURRIULAR

The decision of what extracurricular activities our classes will be participating in varies each year and is determined by staff and the Board of Directors. The "Field Trips" are subject to change each year and are based upon popular response in the past, popular requests and availability of the business/service, etc. If you have any suggestions, please do not hesitate to discuss with your teacher. WHEN DOES THE SCHOOL YEAR START AND END?

The first week of school will be the week following Labor Day. On the first week of class, we have staggered entry. Half the class comes for the first hour, with their parent(s). For the second hour, the second half of the class comes with their parent(s). We will send you an information letter about 3 weeks before the beginning of school year to let you know the time for your child. Our last day of school will be the 3rd Friday in June. Please see the school calendar for exact dates.

WHAT DO I NEED TO BRING WITH ME TO SCHOOL?

A pair of indoor shoes (no slippers, flip flops or marking soles will be allowed). A water bottle with your child's name on it, and a healthy **NUT FREE** snack. A school bag for artwork and information that needs to be sent home (please make sure your school bag is medium in size and will hold, shoes, snack, water bottle and art work. A full change of clothes including pants, shirt, underwear, socks.

SECURITY

For the safety of your child and that of our staff, the doors to the school will remain locked during class time.

CAN I BRING MY OTHER CHILDREN FOR MY CHILD'S SPECIAL DAY?

Due to fire, insurance and licensing regulations, the school cannot have other siblings in the classroom. If you would like to attend your child's special day, we encourage you to find alternate arrangements for younger children. If you are unable to attend, it is still your child's special day. You are welcome to switch with another parent. On your child's special day they can bring one item for show and tell.

WHAT IF MY CHILD IS SICK OR CANNOT MAKE IT TO CLASS?

We really appreciate you letting us know when your child won't be in class. The phone number for the school is 403-852-0788, you can text or call. If there is no answer, please leave a message and it will be directed to the appropriate staff member.

It is really important that if your child is feeling unwell that they remain at home to feel better and return to class quicker. We have found parents whose children were a tad under the weather that stayed home an extra day actually improved our classroom attendance. We kindly ask if your child has a runny nose, fever, cough or is generally not being themselves that they stay home an extra day to feel better. This will allow them to return to school sooner and will keep our other students and teachers healthier all year long!

SOMEONE ELSE WILL BE PICKING MY CHILD UP AFTER SCHOOL.

Please notify the teacher if someone else will be picking up your child if you are unable to be there. We cannot release your child to someone without prior notification. If this person is unfamiliar to the teachers, please text their full name and have them bring photo ID to the school for verification purposes.

INDIVIDUAL AND CLASS PHOTOS

Individual & class photos are taken usually towards the end of September, or beginning of October. We also offer grad photos at the end of the year for our graduating students.

SUBSIDY

The Government of Alberta is offering 2 subsidies for our preschool families.

The Affordability Grant is a monthly payment made to the preschool based on attendance in the program for your child's care. Each student registered will receive up to \$75 per month. Lowering your fees directly.

Child Care Subsidy is applied for by the family. If approved you will receive \$125 per month during your qualified period. Parents can check our website www.serendipityokotoks.com for the link to the subsidy program. You can also search child care subsidy Alberta or go to Alberta.ca for more information. Families who make under \$180,000 will qualify for subsidy. Once approved by the government, please forward the approval letter so we can make note of the coverage and your child's ID so we can report to Alberta Subsidy and receive the payment to cover your child's fees. The Government does not communicate with the Preschool. If we do not receive the letter, then you will be responsible for paying the class fee and will be reimbursed once subsidy is received less an admin fee.
